Tucked among native oak trees, this 1960's home located in Napa, California was transformed by Designer Christine Teicheira of T design. All the existing interior walls were removed, leaving only the outside shell. Christine developed the space plan to give the home harmony.

Featured is the new great room. Originally the master bedroom and living room were separated by a wall, while the kitchen was a small galley located in the middle of the house.

"My goal was to create a contemporary open living space that took advantage of the spectacular views," said Christine.

The kitchen is built into one wall with oak cabinets in an espresso stain. The appliances all in stainless steel boast a unique range hood, to accommodate the taller cook. The solid bamboo

floor was Christine's bling factor, with wild variation in the flooring. The magnification island, 5 x 10, is an entertaining dream as well as a place to sit and take in the setting.

The brown and white theme was continued to the ceiling, painting the open beam trusses, after adding the lighting down the center of the room. A warm fireplace provides a tranquil environment to watch the wondering deer.
